Diploma Course in Photo Journalism

Course Duration : 3 Months

Minimum Qualification : +2 or Equivalent

Batches 2 - Number of Seats : 30

Selection Process : Students will be selected on the basis of

a Merit list based on minimum qualification.

Minimum Age : 18 yrs (Up to 30yrs) on 31/01/2019

Examination : Students have to appear for a written

examination at the conclusion of the course.

A student is deemed to have passed the examination, if he/she gets a minimum of 40% in each part and secures an aggregate

of 40% at the final exam.

Failed candidates can appear for the supplementary exam after paying the requisite exam fee within one year of completion of the course. On no account students can appear after one year.

1. Classes would be held 2 days a week.

Attendance

2. 70% attendance is obligatory. Candidates who fail to appear for examination for shortage of attendance due to illness or other reasons will be considered for continuance of study in the next batch by the Director on his discretion. They would however have to pay the course fees in full or in part as decided by the Director.

Lighting techniques. Flash and other accessories, Understanding Exposure. Metering. Depth of field. Composition – content, framing, backgrounds. Rules of thirds, balancing elements. Breaking the rules and experimentation.

Hard news photography, being ready and reactive. Fieldwork and hard news story. Out of class shoot. Understanding digital images. Image processing tools.

Transferring images to computer. Image processing. Light room, bridge and Photoshop. Image optimisation for print and web. Archiving the image.
